Picture News is a weekly resource to help schools teach current affairs. Our aim is simple: to get all children talking about the news through clear images and a leading question.

Each resource pack includes a vibrant poster based on a news story that is unlikely to be covered in class or school, but poses a fresh opportunity for learning. The packs have an overall 'big' question and related discussion questions and activities. The resources build children's global awareness, and encourage them to debate, form opinions, and respect others' views about topical issues.

What the project entailed:

At Picture News, we are launching a new resource to help educators teach English as an additional language, called Picture News Talk. This new resource uses current affairs and topical issues as a focus for developing children's English language skills.

In light of this development, we recruited Nur as a Researcher and Content Writer for the project. The project helped us learn more about the needs of EAL teachers, as Nur completed a research report featuring a collection of insightful studies and surveys. Using her research and knowledge of teaching English as a second language in Malaysia, Nur also contributed to the creation of a brand-new mock resource for Picture News Talk.
